

ORDINANCE NO. 2140

AN ORDINANCE UPDATING CHAPTER SIX TO BECOME TITLE VI – VEHICLES,  
TRAFFIC AND PARKING OF THE BEND CODE, WHICH INCLUDES A 750-FOOT  
LIMITATION IN SECTION 6.25.020

Findings:

- A. Chapter Six of the Bend Code has not received a complete review since 1982.
- B. A staff review of Chapter Six, comprised of a multi-discipline team, evaluated the current language and made modifications to reflect current statutory requirements, court decisions, and relevance to current conditions.
- C. The staff proposal includes reformatting the Code to allow greater flexibility for future changes to the Code by establishing a Title / Chapter / Section / Subsection structure.
- D. The changes to the Code are in the best interests of the citizens of Bend.

The City of Bend ordains as follows:

Section 1. Bend Code Chapter 6 is amended to read as shown in the attached Exhibit A.

Section 2. The code amendments made by this ordinance supersede any inconsistent material in any previous ordinance or other enactment of the City.







## Exhibit A

### TITLE VI: VEHICLES, TRAFFIC, AND PARKING

#### CHAPTER 6.05 GENERAL PROVISIONS

**6.05.000**     Application of State Traffic Laws All persons shall comply with the Oregon Vehicle Code and Oregon Administrative Rules related to vehicles and traffic. Violations of this chapter may be tried as authorized by state law or as a civil infraction.

**6.05.005**     Forfeiture The City shall comply with State law when seeking forfeiture of a vehicle or other property. Forfeiture will be sought only when authorized by law.

**6.05.010**     Definitions The definitions in this section apply in this title. In addition, definitions contained in the Oregon Vehicle Code apply.

- (1)     Bus stop A space on the edge of a roadway designated by sign or curb marking for use by Bend Area Transit buses.
- (2)     Holiday New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day.
- (3)     Loading zone A space on the edge of a roadway designated by sign or green curb marking for loading or unloading passengers or materials.
- (4)     Motor vehicle Every vehicle that is self-propelled, including tractors, forklift trucks, motorcycles, road-building equipment, street-cleaning equipment, and any other vehicle capable of moving under its own power, even if the vehicle is exempt from licensing under the motor vehicle laws of Oregon.
- (5)     Parking facility Any property used for motor vehicle parking.
- (6)     Pedestrian A person on foot or using an assisted mobility device for use by persons with disabilities.
- (7)     Street Any City administered right of way developed for vehicular travel
- (8)     Traffic lane The area of a street used for movement of a single lane of traffic.

#### CHAPTER 6.10     ADMINISTRATION

##### **6.10.000**     Powers of Road Authority

- (1)     The City Manager is delegated the authority to take the following actions on a permanent or temporary basis and may further delegate the authority:
  - (A)     Designate portions of rights of way where parking or standing is prohibited or restricted or which shall be used for bicycle lanes.
  - (B)     Designate parking spaces and the type, hours and duration of parking permitted including valet parking.
  - (C)     Designate through streets, one-way streets, truck routes, and streets where trucks and heavy

machinery are prohibited, except as needed to perform work or deliver or pick up materials.

- (D) Designate locations for traffic control devices.
  - (E) Establish bus stops.
  - (F) Designate the location of loading zones.
  - (G) Provide appropriate signs and marking relating traffic, traffic control, pedestrians, crosswalks, school zones, and parking.
  - (H) Close or restrict the use of streets and sidewalks.
- (2) The City Council delegates to the City Manager the authority to make all initial decisions relating to the exercise of the powers of a road authority under State law. The City Manager may further delegate the authority granted under this section.
  - (3) The delegation of road authority to the City Manager does not deprive the City Council of its power to act as the City's final road authority.
  - (4) The City Manager may issue permits or establish parking regulations or requirements that the City Manager determines are necessary for the effective utilization and regulation of parking within the city.

**6.10.005 Review or Appeal of Decision or Action of City Manager**

Any decision or action of the City Manager or designee in this chapter is subject to appeal to or review by the City Council.

- (1) Any person affected by a decision or action of the City Manager or designee under this chapter may appeal the decision or action to the City Council by filing a written appeal with the City Recorder within 10 calendar days of the decision or action. In the event that the appellant had no reasonable basis for knowing of the decision or action, the appeal must be filed within 10 calendar days of the date the person knew or should have known of the decision or action.
- (2) The City Manager or any Council member may initiate a review of any decision or action by the City Manager under Section 6.05.010 by placing the matter on the Council agenda.
- (3) The Council may but is not required to give deference to the City Manager's decision in making its decision.

**6.10.010 Retention of Authority by Council**

- (1) The Council may on its own initiative or at the request of the City Manager make an initial decision on a matter within the road authority of the City.
- (2) If the Council makes a decision either as an initial decision or on appeal or review, that decision shall be binding on the City Manager and staff for a period of five years unless the Council decision is withdrawn.
- (3) The City Council retains all its authority relating to the vacation of rights of way.

**6.10.015 Standards City traffic regulations shall be based on:**

- (1) Traffic engineering principles and traffic investigations.

- (2) Standards, limitations and rules promulgated by the Oregon Transportation Commission.
- (3) Other recognized traffic control standards, including the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

**6.10.020 Authority of Police and Fire Officers and Others:**

- (1) It shall be the duty of police officers to enforce the provisions of this code.
- (2) In the event of a fire or other public emergency, police and fire officers may direct traffic as conditions require, notwithstanding the provisions of this code.
- (3) Parking violations may be enforced by an agent of the City authorized in writing by the Chief of Police to issue parking citations.

**CHAPTER 6.15 TRAFFIC REGULATIONS**

**6.15.000 Crossing Private Property**

- (1) The operator of a vehicle shall not proceed from a street to another street by crossing private property. This provision shall not apply to stops on the property to procure or provide goods or services.
- (2) A violation of this section is a Class C civil infraction.

**6.15.005 Throwing Material From a Vehicle**

- (1) It is unlawful to throw, drop or otherwise discard any item from a vehicle onto any public right of way or premises open to the public.
- (2) A violation of this section is a Class B Civil Infraction.

**6.15.010 Obstructing Public Ways**

- 1) Except as authorized in subsection 2, no unauthorized person shall obstruct a public way, including streets, alleys and sidewalks, by depositing or storing personal property or other material on public ways or by any other manner obstructing or interfering with public ways. Obstruction of a sidewalk is a violation, even if the adjacent street is not obstructed.
- (2) Merchandise or equipment delivery is allowed for the time needed to accomplish the delivery, not to exceed 10 minutes, or between the hours of 8 P.M. and 11 A.M. Delivery authorized under this section shall minimize obstruction of public ways to the extent possible.
- (3) An authorized obstruction of a public way between sunset and sunrise shall be illuminated by warning lights or reflective materials clearly visible 200 feet in all directions.
- (4) No person shall use a public way for display or sale of goods except as authorized by the City.
- (5) No person shall deposit garbage, earth, debris or rubbish of any kind on a public way, in the Deschutes River or any irrigation canals within the city unless authorized by the City.

- (6) A violation of this section is a Class B civil infraction, A violation of subsection 2 may be cited as a parking violation.

**6.15.015 Sidewalks**

- (1) No person shall ride, drive or operate a motor vehicle on or across a public sidewalk within the City except at driveway access points.
- (2) This section shall not apply to motorized vehicles used for public safety, snow removal, maintenance and repair, or mobility devices used by persons with disabilities.
- (3) A violation of this section is a Class A Civil Infraction.

**6.15.020 Streets Prohibited to Trucks:**

- (1) When the use of a street is prohibited to trucks exceeding a specified weight, no person shall operate a truck on the street contrary to the prohibition except for the purpose of delivering or picking up materials or merchandise and then only by entering the street at the intersection nearest the destination of the vehicle and leaving by the shortest route.
- (2) A violation of this section is a Class C civil infraction.

**6.15.025 Removing Glass and Debris:**

- (1) A party to a vehicle crash or a person causing broken glass or other debris to be deposited on a street shall be responsible for the removal of glass or other debris from the street.
- (2) A violation of this section is a Class C civil infraction.

**CHAPTER 6.20 PARKING REGULATIONS**

**6.20.000 Method of Parking:**

- (1) Except as authorized by subsection 2, where parking spaces are marked on a street or City owned parking facility, no person shall stand or park a vehicle other than within a single marked space, both width and length, unless authorized by the City.
- (2) In areas marked for parallel parking, oversized vehicles may use up to two parking spaces as needed for vehicle length.
- (3) No vehicle shall park in an angled parking stall in a manner that causes them to drive into the oncoming traffic flow when exiting the parking stall.
- (4) Vehicles parked parallel shall be parked in the direction of the traffic flow in the adjacent traffic lane.

**6.20.005 Prohibited Parking ,Stopping or Standing on Public Right of Way**

No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a peace officer or official traffic control device, under any of the following circumstances:

- (1) A truck in excess of 12,000 pounds between the hours of 9:00 P.M. and 7:00 A.M. in front of or adjacent to a residence.
- (2) A vehicle in or blocking an alley, except for a stop of not more than 15 consecutive minutes for loading or unloading persons or materials and

must display emergency flashers.

- (3) A vehicle in violation of a sign placed by the City of Bend.
- (4) Adjacent to a curb painted yellow by the City of Bend to designate No Parking at any time.
- (5) Adjacent to a curb painted green by the City of Bend to designate a loading zone unless involved in the act of loading.
- (6) Adjacent to a curb painted red by the City of Bend to designate a fire lane or special security area.
- (7) Parking the vehicle for the primary purpose of displaying the vehicle for sale.
- (8) Repairing or servicing the vehicle, except repairs necessitated by an emergency.
- (9) Selling merchandise from the vehicle, except when authorized by the City.
- (10) Storage for more than five calendar days.
- (11) Parking of a vehicle with a vehicle registration that has been expired for more than 30 days.
- (12) Adjacent to or within 10 feet of a fire hydrant
- (13) On a sidewalk.
- (14) Any other violation of State law.

**6.20.010 Unlawful Parking of Vehicle for Sale at Private Parking Facility**

- (1) No person shall leave or park a vehicle at a private parking facility for the principal purpose of selling said vehicle if there is a sign displayed, that complies with subsection (2), below, in plain view at the facility.
- (2) Signs prohibiting the parking of a vehicle for the purpose of sale posted after the effective date of this section shall state:

No Parking of Vehicles for Sale.  
Bend Code Chapter 6

Signs posted under previous versions of this section shall remain effective.

- (3) The provisions of this code section supplement all other remedies available to owners of parking facilities relating to unlawfully parked vehicles, including ORS 98.805 - 98.818.

**6.20.015 Use of Loading Zone** No person shall stand or park a vehicle for any purpose or length of time in a place designed as a loading zone when the hours applicable to that loading zone are in effect, except for loading or unloading persons or materials. When the hours applicable to the loading zone are in effect, the stop for loading and unloading shall not exceed the time limits posted. If no time limits are posted, use of the zone shall not exceed 30 minutes. Vehicles must display emergency flashers for duration of loading/unloading.

**6.20.020 Unattended Vehicles** When a police officer finds an unlocked motor vehicle parked or standing unattended with the ignition key in the vehicle, the officer is authorized to remove the key from the vehicle.

**6.20.025     Downtown District**

- (1) The downtown district encompasses all streets, alleys, parking lots and sidewalks within the following boundary description:

Beginning at the North side of Newport Avenue and the Deschutes River, thence South along the Deschutes River from Newport Avenue to the South side of Franklin Avenue, thence East on Franklin Avenue to the West side of Broadway Street, thence south on Broadway Street to the South side of Louisiana Avenue, thence East on Louisiana Avenue from Broadway Street to the West side of Wall Street, thence South on Wall Street from Louisiana Avenue to the South side of Kansas Street, thence Easterly from Kansas and Wall Street through the Administrative School District property to the Southeast corner of the intersection of Kansas and Lave Street, thence Northeast on Lava Street to the North side of Franklin Avenue, thence East from the Northeast corner of Franklin Avenue and Lava Street to the West side of Division Avenue, thence North on the West side of Division to the South side of Greenwood Avenue, thence West on Greenwood Avenue to the Southeast corner of Greenwood Avenue and Harriman Street, thence North (across Greenwood Avenue) to the Northeast corner of Greenwood Avenue and Harriman Street, thence West to the Northeast corner of Greenwood Avenue and Bond Street to the Junction of Bond Street and Wall Street, crossing Wall Street to the West side of Wall Street and the Northwest corner of Wall Street and Vermont Place, thence West along the North side of Vermont Place to the Deschutes River, thence South to the Point of Beginning (as shown on Attached Exhibit A).

- (2) Within the downtown district, the City Manager or designee shall cause each parking space in a street or within an off-street parking area to be clearly marked. The City Manager or designee shall determine the necessity for and the size and location of all parking spaces according to his or her reasonable determination of the safety, convenience and necessity of the public. Such markings may include markings to reserve one or more spaces exclusively for parking of motorbikes, motor scooters, motorcycles, bicycles, recreational vehicles, other oversized vehicles and any other legally operable vehicle and parking for persons with disabilities.

**CHAPTER 6.25     PARKING CITATION AND OWNER RESPONSIBILITY**

**6.25.000     Illegally Parked Vehicle**

- (1) Parking citations shall be placed conspicuously on the vehicle. The registered owner of the vehicle shall be responsible for the citation unless the driver accepts responsibility.
- (2) If parking is subject to a time limit, separate citations may be issued if the duration exceeds multiple increments of the posted time.
- (3) Within ten days of the issuance of the parking citation:
- (a) The required penalty must be paid;
  - (b) A written response contesting the ticket must be filed; or
  - (c) A written request for an in-person hearing must be filed.
- (4) The citation shall state the penalties that may be imposed for failure to comply.
- (5) The City Manager may appoint one or more persons to serve as hearings officers to review written responses and/or hold in-person hearings. If the City Manager does not appoint a hearings officer, the Municipal Court

Judge shall act as hearings officer.

**6.25.005 Failure to Comply with Parking Citation**

If section 6.25.000(3) is not complied with, the City or its designee shall provide written notice to the owner or lessee of the vehicle. The notice shall provide information related to additional charges, as established in the City's Fees and Charges Resolution.

- (1) If the City has contracted the enforcement of parking violations that contractor or its agent may collect the delinquent fines, impose additional charges for the collection efforts undertaken, and may immobilize or impound the vehicle pursuant to Bend Code subsection 2 of this section. These additional collection charges shall be established in the City's Fees and Charges Resolution.
- (2) A vehicle for which a citation has been issued and remains unpaid after becoming due may be immobilized or impounded. A vehicle that has been immobilized or impounded shall not be released until all outstanding penalties and charges have been paid to the City or its designee.
- (3) No person other than an authorized City agent shall remove or attempt to remove an immobilizer device; and no person shall move or attempt to move an immobilized vehicle until the immobilizer device is removed.
- (4) A violation of this subsection is a class A Civil Infraction.

**6.25.010 Owner/Lessee Responsibility**

The owner or lessee of a vehicle in violation of a parking restriction is responsible for the offense, but it shall be an affirmative defense that the vehicle was used without the owner's or lessee's consent.

**6.25.015 Registered Owner Presumption**

In a proceeding against a vehicle owner charging violation of a parking restriction, proof that the vehicle was registered to the defendant at the time of the violation shall constitute a rebuttable presumption that the defendant was the owner.

**6.25.020 Extending Parking Time**

Where maximum parking time limits are designated, movement of a vehicle to another time limited parking space within a 750 foot radius shall not extend the time limits for parking.

**6.25.025 Illegal Issuance of a Parking Citation:**

- (1) Except as authorized by Oregon Revised Statutes, no person shall issue a parking citation unless authorized by the Chief of Police.
- (2) A violation of this section is a Class B civil infraction.

**6.25.030 Illegal Cancellation of Parking Citation:**

- (1) No person shall dismiss a parking citation in any manner, except when approved by the parking hearings officer or City validation program.
- (2) An authorized agent of the City may reduce the penalty for parking in a space reserved for persons with disabilities if the citation recipient can provide a copy of a valid placard and proper identification. The reduction shall be no less than established in ORS 811.615 (7). The authority in this section may be exercised for up to five violations per person within one year.
- (3) A violation of this section is a Class B civil infraction.

**6.25.035 Improper Parking Citation Validation**

- (1) Any parking validation program shall be for over-time parking only.
- (2) No person shall validate a parking citation in a manner inconsistent with the parking validation program.
- (3) A violation of this subsection is a Class B civil infraction.

**6.25.040 Fraudulent Use of a Parking Permit**

- (1) No person shall use a parking permit in a fraudulent manner, such as:
  - (A) Alteration or duplication of any kind of a City issued parking permit.
  - (B) Use of a permit belonging to another.
- (2) A violation of this subsection is a Class B civil infraction.

**6.25.045 Habitual Parking Offender**

- (1) The penalty for repeated parking violations within any 365 consecutive day period shall be increased as follows:
  - (A) Five to nine parking violations: 200% of the otherwise applicable penalty.
  - (B) Ten to fourteen parking violations: 300% of the otherwise applicable penalty.
  - (C) Fifteen or more parking violations: 400% of the otherwise applicable penalty.

**CHAPTER 6.30 ENFORCEMENT:**

**6.30.000 Parking Penalties**

- (1) A violation of section 6.25, unless otherwise defined in the subsection, is punishable by a penalty in the amount established by the City Fee Resolution.
- (2) Disabled parking violations are punishable by the amount established by Oregon State Law.

**6.30.005 Removal (Towing) of Illegally Parked Vehicles**

- (1) The City may remove any illegally parked vehicle that is unattended or that is not removed after a request is made to the owner or person in charge of the vehicle.
- (2) Except as provided in subsection 3, the City shall not remove any vehicle that was originally legally parked unless:
  - (A) The vehicle has remained illegally parked for a period three times longer than the time originally allowed for the vehicle to be parked,
  - (B) Removal is needed for street cleaning, snow removal or maintenance,
  - (C) The vehicle is obstructing traffic, or
  - (D) The vehicle has been parked for more than five days.

- (3) Vehicles parked on a street that has been closed or scheduled for closure may be towed.

## **CHAPTER 6.35 BICYCLES**

**6.35.000 Bicycle Operating Rules** Except for bicycles operated by on duty law enforcement personnel:

- (1) Bicycles shall be parked so they do not obstruct a roadway, sidewalk, driveway or building entrance
- (2) Bicycles shall not be ridden on a sidewalk in the Downtown District described in section 6.190 or in the Centennial Parking Garage.
- (3) A violation of this section is a Class C civil infraction.

**6.35.000 Registration** The Police Department may provide a bicycle registering service for the purpose of returning lost or stolen bicycles.

### **6.35.005 Impounding Bicycles**

- (1) A bicycle left on public property for more than 24 hours may be impounded by the Police Department.
- (2) If a bicycle impounded under this code is registered, or other means of determining its ownership exist, the police shall make a reasonable effort to notify the owner. No impounding fee shall be charged to the owner of a stolen bike.
- (3) A bicycle impounded under this code and remaining unclaimed shall be disposed of in accordance with City procedures for disposal of abandoned or lost personal property.
- (4) Except as provided in subsection (2), a fee established in the City's Fee Resolution shall be charged to the owner of a bicycle impounded under this section.

## **CHAPTER 6.40 SKATEBOARDS AND ROLLER SKATES**

### **6.40.000 Roller-skates and Skateboards**

- (1) No person shall use roller-skates, skateboards, scooters or similar devices on the sidewalks in the Downtown District as defined in Bend Code 6.20.025 or in any parking facility owned by the City.
- (2) A violation of any subsection of this section is a Class C civil infraction.




6.017 Certain Vehicles as Nuisances. The following motor vehicles are hereby declared to be nuisances and subject to forfeiture:

(1) A motor vehicle operated by a person whose operator's license is suspended or revoked or in violation of a hardship or probationary permit in violation of the provisions of ORS 811.182; and

(2) A motor vehicle operated by a person under the influence of intoxicants in violation of ORS 813.010, where the person has:

(a) Participated in a driving under the influence of intoxicants diversion program as provided for by the Oregon Revised Statutes, or its statutory counterparts in any jurisdiction within ten years prior to arrest or citation; or

(b) Been convicted or forfeited bail or security within the previous ten years of:

(A) Driving Under the Influence of intoxicants under ORS 813.010 or its statutory counterpart in any jurisdiction; or

(B) Any degree of murder, manslaughter, criminally negligent homicide or assault resulting from the operation of a motor vehicle, or

machinery are prohibited, except as needed to perform work or deliver or pick up materials.

- (D) Designate locations for traffic control devices.
- (E) Establish bus stops.

(2) The City Council delegates to the City Manager the authority to make all initial decisions relating to the exercise of the powers of a road authority under State law. The City Manager may further delegate the authority granted under this section.

(3) The delegation of road authority to the City Manager does not deprive the City Council of its power to act as the City's final road authority.

(4) The City Manager may issue permits or establish parking regulations or requirements that the City Manager determines are necessary for the effective utilization and regulation of parking within the City.

**6.10.005 Review or Appeal of Decision or Action of City Manager** Any decision or action of the City Manager or designee in this chapter is subject to appeal to or review by the City Council.

(1) Any person affected by a decision or action of the City Manager or designee under this chapter may appeal the decision or action to the City Council by filing a written appeal with the City Recorder within 10 calendar days of the decision or action. In the event that the appellant had no reasonable basis for knowing of the decision or action, the appeal must be filed within 10 calendar days of the date the person knew or should have known of the decision or action.

(2) The City Manager or any Council member may initiate a review of any decision or action by the City Manager under Section 6.020 by placing the matter on the Council agenda.

(3) The Council may but is not required to give deference to the City Manager's decision in making its decision.

**6.10.010 Retention of Authority by Council**

(1) The Council may on its own initiative or at the request of the City Manager make an initial decision on a matter within the road authority of the City.

(2) Within the downtown district, the City Manager or designee shall cause each parking space in a street or within an off-street parking area to be clearly marked. The City Manager or designee shall determine the necessity for and the size and location of all parking spaces according to his or her reasonable determination of the safety, convenience and necessity of the public. Such markings may include markings to reserve one or more spaces exclusively for parking of motorbikes, motor scooters, motorcycles, bicycles, recreational vehicles, other oversized vehicles and any other legally operable vehicle and parking for persons with disabilities.

CHAPTER 6.25 PARKING CITATION AND OWNER RESPONSIBILITY

(2) Within the downtown district designated in subsection (1) of this ordinance, the City Manager or designee shall cause each parking space in a street or within an off-street parking area to be clearly marked. The City Manager or designee shall determine the necessity for and the size and location of all parking spaces according to his or her reasonable determination of the safety, convenience and necessity of the public. Such markings may include markings to reserve one or more spaces exclusively for parking of motorbikes, motor scooters, motorcycles, bicycles, recreational vehicles, other oversized vehicles and any other legally operable vehicle and handicapped parking.¶


