



# MOBILE HOME SAFETY TIPS

Unique hazards increase danger for people who live in mobile homes:

Take time to review your home inside and out to ensure you know what to do in the event of an emergency. If there are areas of concern, correct them as soon as possible.

## General Home Safety

- Ensure you have more than one way for you to out of your home
- Working smoke alarms save lives! Check your smoke alarm regularly
- Ensure smoking materials are out when done with them
- Have a fire escape plan. Practice it
- If you can't get out, use a cell phone to stay in touch with 9-1-1 dispatchers
- Ensure all electrical devices are properly plugged in
- The elderly or those with disabilities may need assistance in evacuating
- Make sure you address is visible from the street
- Don't park in front of fire hydrants and don't park in fire lanes and when friends visit, be sure to remind them to park only in appropriate parking areas

Mobile home parks are typically very densely populated with homes only feet apart from one another. A fire in one can quickly spread to the neighbors. Ensuring safety in your home can also help protect your neighbor as well.
