

RESOLUTION NO. 3007

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE DOWNTOWN PARKING STAKEHOLDER COMMITTEE

Findings

- A. The City Council has asked for input on approaches to the provision and regulation of vehicle parking in the Downtown parking district. In addition to obtaining input from consultants and staff, the City Council wants to obtain input from interested parties. It will also obtain input from the general public when it adopts any measures that affect downtown parking.
- B. Bend Code 1.20.015H authorizes the Council to establish temporary committees by resolution.
- C. The Council wishes to establish a Downtown Parking Stakeholder Committee.

Based on these findings, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEND RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Downtown Parking Stakeholder Committee is established to consist of 13 members. The membership shall consist of the following:

- Two members of the Downtown Bend Business Association (DBBA)
- One business representative that supports multi-modal options
- One member of the Old Bend Neighborhood Association Board
- One member of the RiverWest Neighborhood Association Board
- One business representative from outside the EID area
- One employee who works in the City's downtown parking district
- One employee who works outside the City's downtown parking district
- One property owner from outside the EID
- One representative of the accessibility community
- Three at large community members

Section 2. The representatives of the DBBA and the neighborhood associations shall be selected by those organizations, and this resolution constitutes the mayor's appointment and the council's confirmation of those appointment under Bend Code 1.20.010E.

Section 3. The committee shall meet for at least the months outlined in Phase 1 of City's Parking Study contract with Rick Williams Consulting (ST15RA_Parking Study) and, if needed, may continue to meet for the time needed to complete all phases of the study.

Section 4. The committee shall review the City's downtown parking management district and program and recommend changes to the district and program, including possible changes to the comprehensive plan and city codes. The committee may recommend parking-related capital improvement projects.

Section 5. The committee may make recommendations to the Bend Planning Commission, the Bend Economic Development Advisory Board (BEDAB), the Transportation Safety Advisory Committee (TSAC), and, if necessary, directly to the Bend City Council.

Section 6. This resolution takes effect immediately on passage.

Adopted by roll call vote of the Bend City Council on September 16, 2015.
