I. GUIDELINES FOR DOWNTOWN RESIDENTIAL PARKING


Permit Parking for Downtown Residents

Verifying Eligibility

To receive a residential parking permit, a downtown resident must bring in proof of residency (lease agreement or utility bill, etc.) and photo ID. Residential permits will not be issued without the proper paperwork and identification. Eligibility must be verified every time a new permit is issued to verify that the person has not moved.

Cost

Residential permits are free to residents living inside the Downtown Parking District, but outside of the downtown core. The downtown core [Pink Zone] is defined as the area from Franklin Avenue to Greenwood Avenue and from Lava Road to Brooks Alley/Street – see map below. For residents living within the downtown core, permits are \$50 a month to park in the Mirror Pond lots or the Greenwood and Wall lot. To encourage residents within the downtown core to consider other options, residents are also eligible for the reduced rate permits at the Newport Lot (\$15/month) and the roof of the Garage (\$15/month). This customer friendly policy encourages residents to park in less congested permit areas.





Where Residents Can Park

Permit holders outside of the downtown core [Yellow, Green, Blue Zones] can park within a block of their residence (address information is kept on file). Residents within the core can park at various lots depending on the location of their residence. These lots are the Mirror Pond lots and the Greenwood and Wall lot. The parking garage permits are the same price as the residential permits, so residents at the Putnam Point apartments and residents living on the 00 block of Minnesota can simply purchase garage permits.

How Many Residential Permits are issued?

Permits are only for residents and not for guests. Permits are only issued directly to residents. Addresses with no off-street parking are eligible for 2 parking permits. Addresses with 1 off-street parking space are eligible for 1 parking permit. Addresses with 2 or more off-street parking spaces are not eligible for any residential parking permits. Additional permits can be purchased at regular price for the City's designated parking permit areas.
